

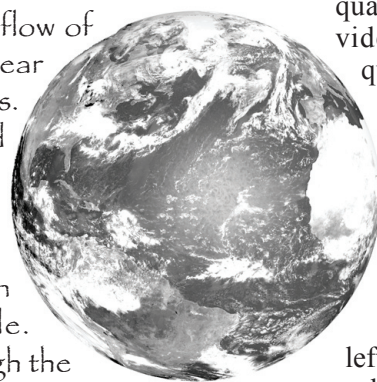

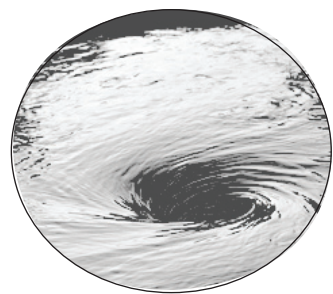

Nature works in cycles—a constant flow of change and transition through non-linear structures and movements.

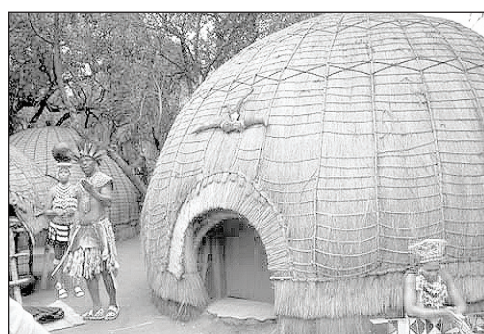
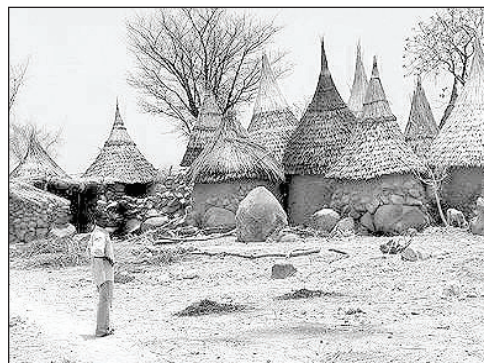
Through the ebb and flow of it all, each of us is alive for a time; we prosper and decay, then perish in an ever-changing cycle. "We," as Man, live on through the generations.

3. Natural Man, now nearly extinct with the advent of "civilization," lived with the cycles of nature and took his sustenance directly from the changing seasonal products of Nature. Feast and famine were shared, as tribes, clans, families and other community bonds were formed. The individual could contribute to the community and the community in turn would enhance the well being of the individual. Such circular living tended to "shape" the thinking of Natural Man and was reflected in his choice of abode.

4. MODERN MAN, THAT SO-CALLED CIVILIZED CREATURE, HAS A DIFFERENT "SHAPE"—THE RECTANGLE. OUR MODERN WORLD IS PERMEATED WITH THE STRAIGHT LINE AND ESPECIALLY THE RIGHT ANGLE.

5. The right angle is a quarter of a circle. Divide a circle into four quarters and turn the corners inside out. The straight lines will naturally join together again and form a square—an equilateral rectangle.

Upon our planet and in spite of the common sense and logic of following terrain and waterways, a "grid" of longitudinal and latitudinal "property" definition has been laid down by Rectoid society.



7. What we live in shapes the mind. There are at least two parts to our minds. Leaving aside any discussion on the intuitive or superconscious mind, there is the subconscious and the conscious mind.

The conscious mind is like the RAM and screen of a computer. It brings up "windows" focusing on a relatively limited amount of sensory information. The subconscious mind is like a giant hard drive. It merely records a vast sensory experience and the resulting information, which it makes available (when our memory is working) to the conscious mind.

Right now your conscious mind is focused on the word groups in this sentence and the meaning they impart, while the subconscious mind is doing much more. It also is listening to the sounds in the street, the room you are in, or a spot in nature, depending on your present location. All the visual stimuli are being recorded, including your peripheral vision, as well as your skin's sensations, scents, tastes and any other sensory information that the subconscious mind can absorb. Also called the unconscious mind, it does all this without bothering to inform and confuse the narrowly focused conscious mind with the vast details.

As an example of subconscious activity, first we make a conscious effort to learn to drive a car and develop the necessary skills. Once the conscious mind's efforts and the subconscious mind's database of experience have been recorded, driving becomes automatic.

Have you ever been lost in thought or caught up in conversation while the subconscious mind monitored your vehicle and road speed, scanned for traffic and obstacles, adjusted your velocity and trajectory and kept you safely between the lines, as many miles have gone behind you?

Even walking is not really a conscious effort. You may consciously think about moving somewhere, but you don't consciously think through and plan each movement of your legs, paying attention to each moment of balance and each step you take during your bipedal transition to another location. The subconscious handles the details based on years of stored information and a vast array of sensory input.

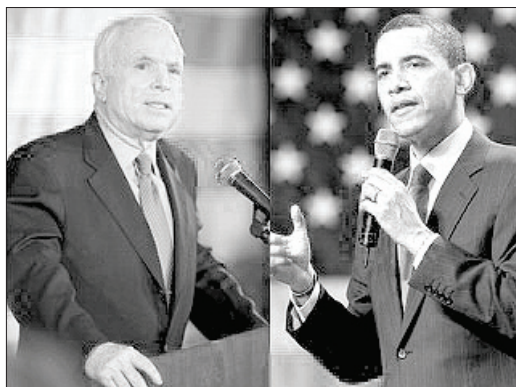

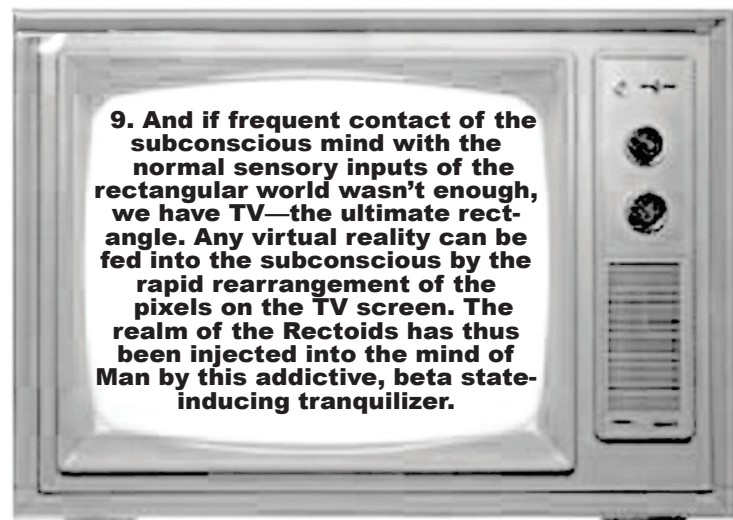

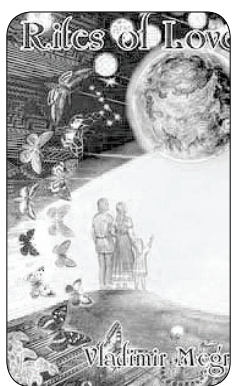
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
